3. Be an NSS Volunteer

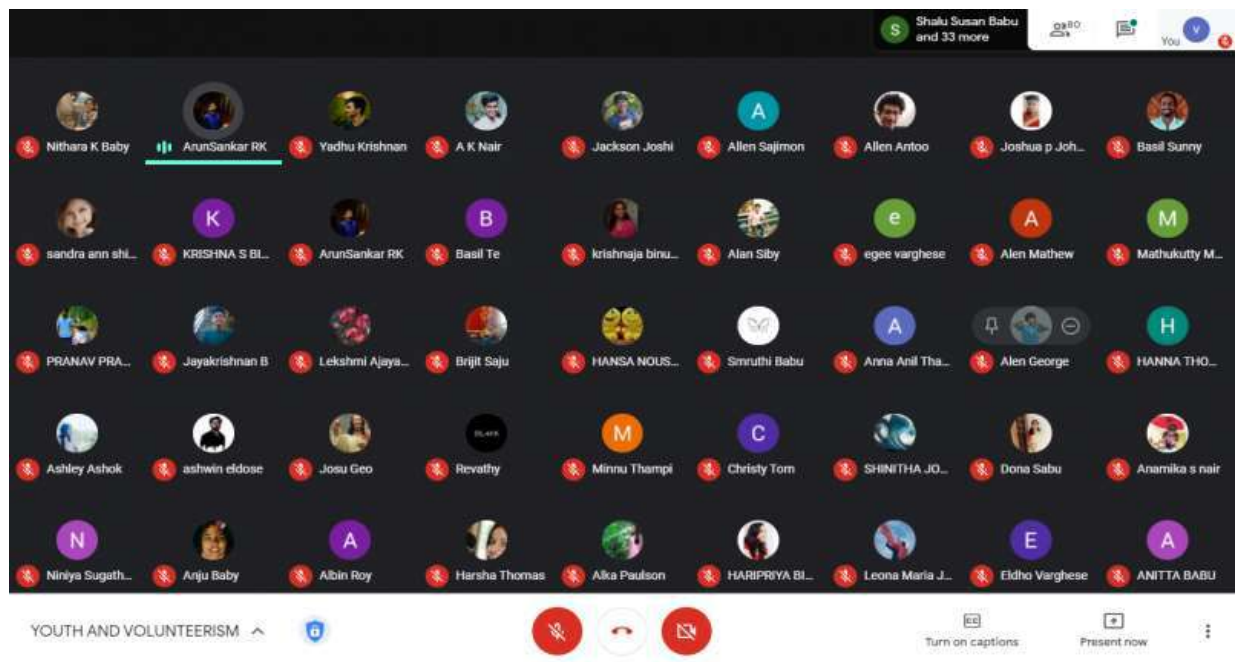

18. NRPF Registration

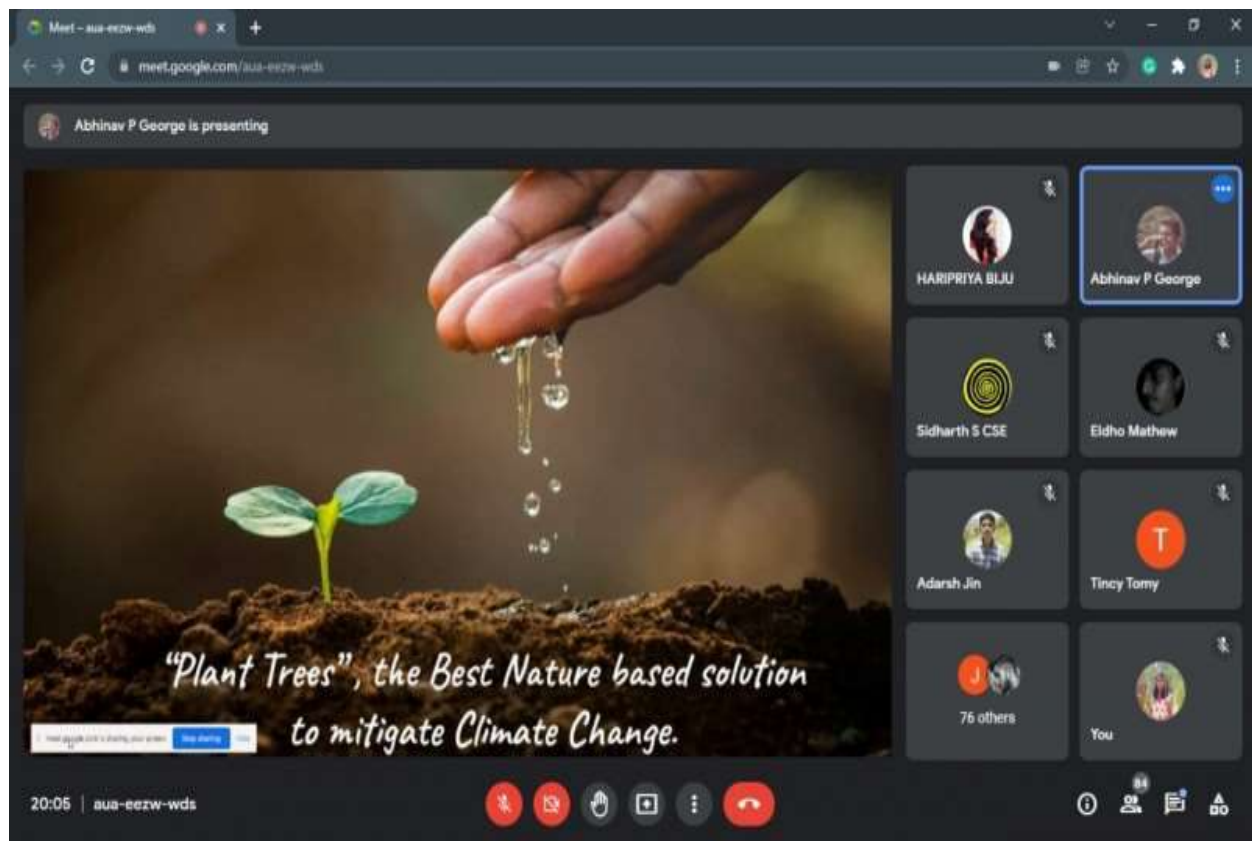

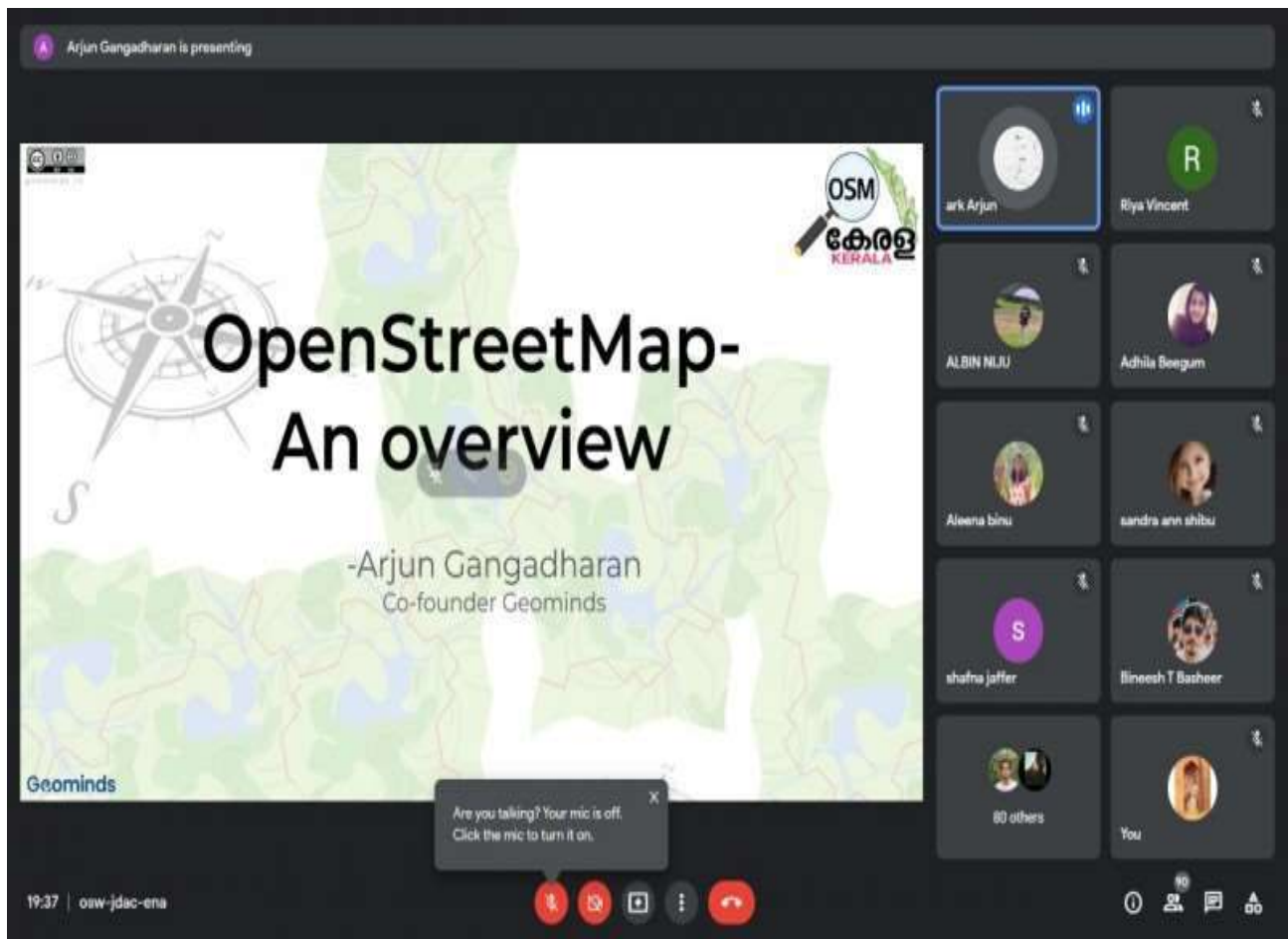
19. Open Street Mapping Day -1

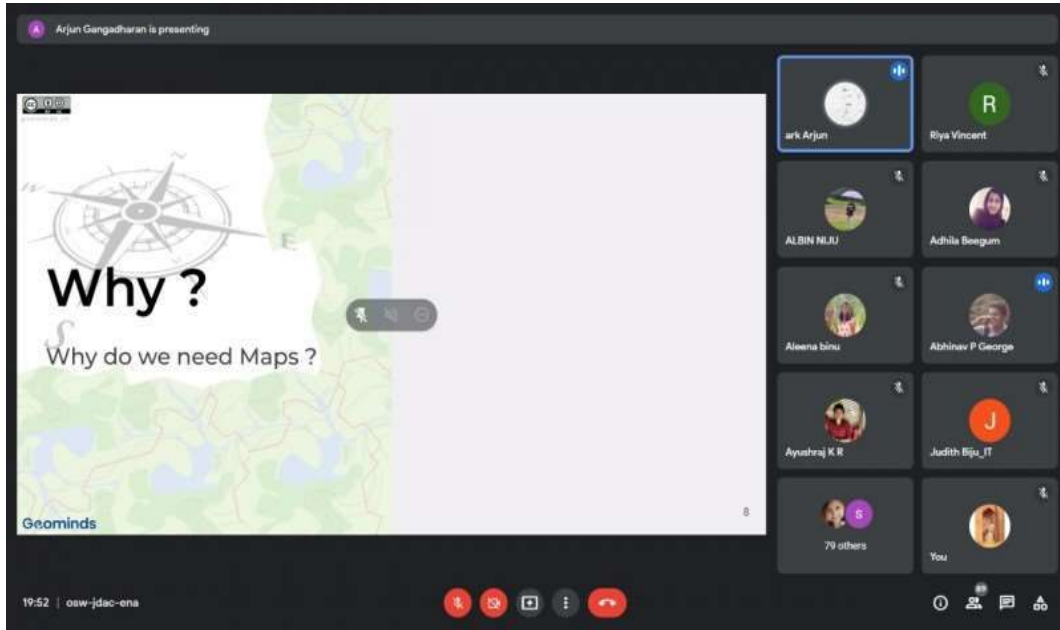

- HB count should be less than 12 grams per deciliter (120 grams per liter) for women and less than 13.5 (135 grams per liter) for men.
- Hemoglobin levels depend on many factors, including age, race, gender and the general health of the person.
- HB count can be maintained by consuming Pomegranate, dates, peanuts etc.
- High count of HB in body makes too many red blood cells, causing the blood to be thicker than usual. This can lead to clots, heart attacks, and strokes.



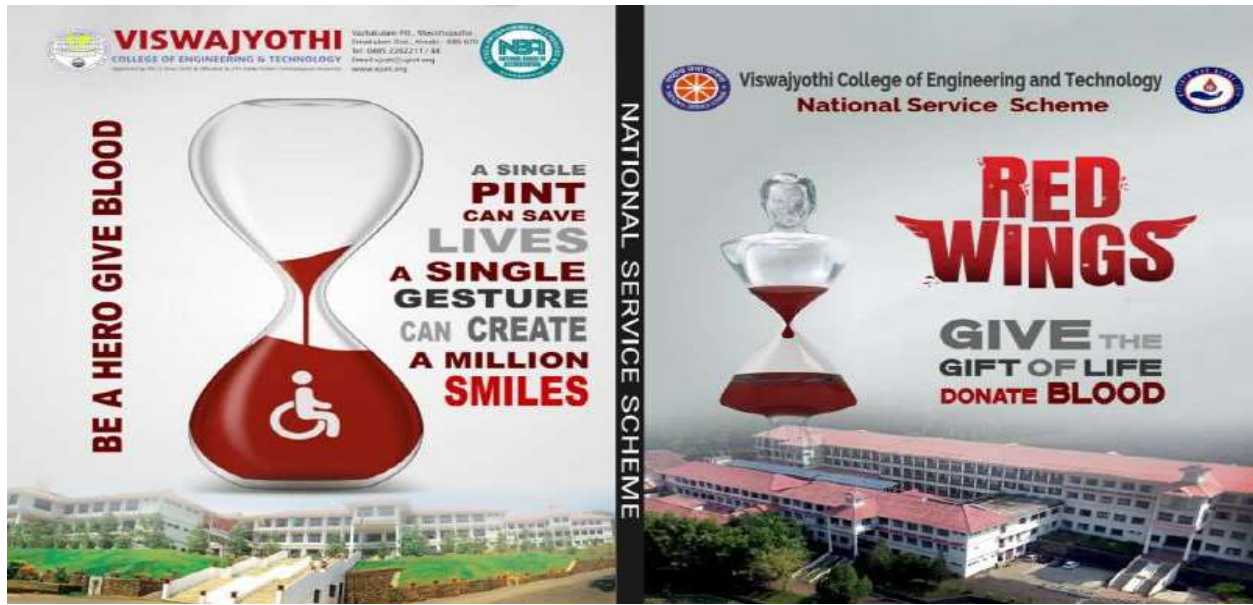

46. Blood Donation Camp (Stage 1)

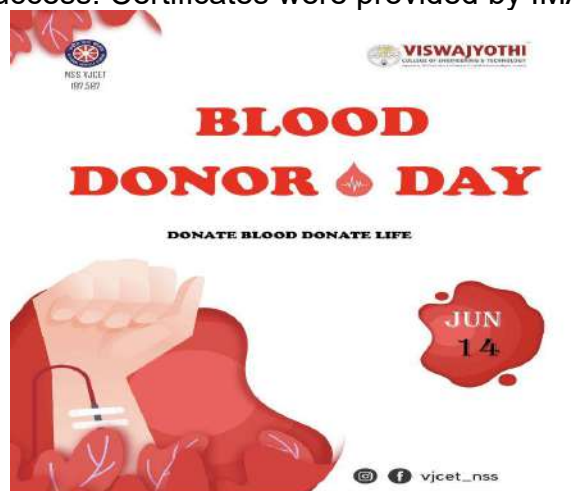

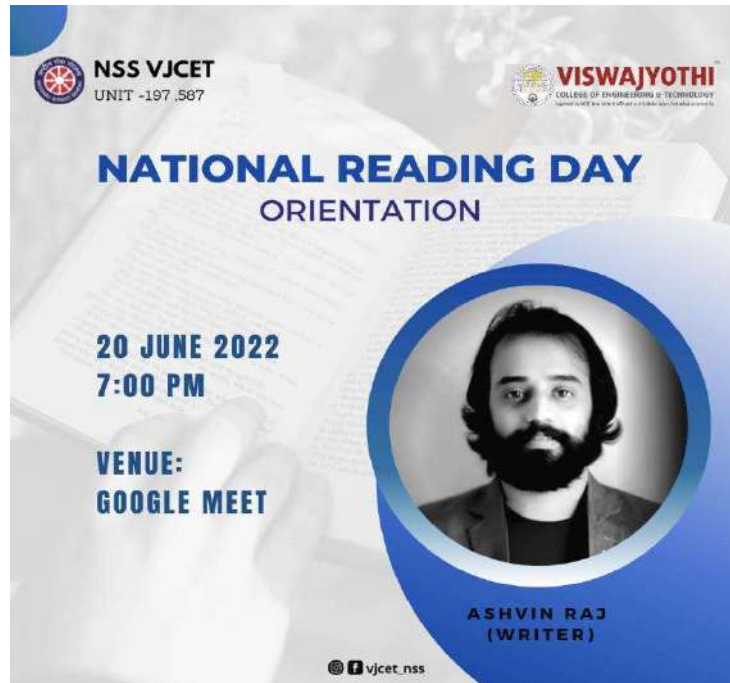
48. National Reading Day- Orientation
